

What is the Premier's Reading Challenge?

The Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) is a challenge to each student to read, to read more and to read more widely. It aims to encourage in students a love of reading for leisure and pleasure and to enable them to experience quality literature.

When is the PRC?

The PRC runs from Monday 28th February to Friday 19th August 2022.

What do students need to do?

Students must read a set number of books to meet the Challenge:

• Kindergarten to Year 2 students – 30 books.

At least 25 books must be on the PRC booklist. These books can be read to the student, read with the student or read by the student.

• **Year 3 to 6 students** – 20 books.

At least 15 books must be on the PRC booklist and must be read by the student.

Many of the books on the list are in our school library for students to borrow.

How do students record books read?

Students in K-2 can use the <u>Personal Reading Log</u> for parents and carers to record books read. This needs to be returned to school before August 20 so books can be entered online. Alternatively, books can be entered online on the <u>student site</u> using the student's username and password.

Students in Years 3-6 will be responsible for recording books on their reading log and entering them online on the PRC website. They will be given time at school to do this.

When will students receive their certificate?

Students who complete the PRC will receive a certificate in Term 4. Student names are no longer listed on an honour roll, however they may be recognised through media publications or through the school's newsletters and communications. No student names and/or details will be published publicly without prior consent from parents/carers.
