2018 & 2019

The area from Saltwater Creek (which runs from the lower side of Bonny Hills Beach Hotel) through to St Kitts Way, defined by the entrance to the estate at Seawind Chase, will be a shared enrolment zone for North Haven PS and Lake Cathie PS for 2018 and 2019.

From 2019 schools will not be accepting out of zone enrolments.

From 2020 this area will be zoned North Haven PS only.

Note: From 2020, siblings of students who have a current enrolment at Lake Cathie Public School will be entitled to have enrolment at Lake Cathie Public School for as long as the family resides within the area defined above.


SENTRAL PARENT PORTAL AND APP




