BUSH FIRE

This week has been a very different week at Lake Cathie Public School with the bush fires so close to our school and many of our homes.

I am extremely proud of the teamwork I have witnessed from our school community and in particular our LCPS staff.

On Tuesday when we acted upon the Emergency Management plan, staff were calm, careful and systematic in their response to the proceedings.

This meant that we had very little worry or anxiety from our students, being our main priority.

This week every decision made has had the students and staff's wellbeing at the forefront.

Thank you to our amazing Department of Education support personnel who were ensuring that we here at Lake Cathie Public School were safe and supported.

Mr Andrew Kuchling, Director School Educational Leadership, has been a fabulous support and has been in constant contact providing updates and advice from the Rural Fire Services and Work, Health and Safety officers within the Department of Education.

I feel extremely fortunate to be working for such a professional and well structured organisation.

Yesterday during the staff professional learning session, we had a visit from Stuart Robb, Learning and Development Officer RFS, who gave us the most recent update about the fires.

The current advice from the RFS and the Department OF Education is that schools will remain operational as normal.

Students will not be allowed to play and have break times outside until the air quality improves and this may mean recess and lunch occurring inside into next week.

All staff are on site and classes are taking place as normal.

Students are happy and learning.

The afternoon Lake Cathie buses, 71 and 72, continue to run today Thursday 31 October and tomorrow Friday 1 November. We strongly advise parents/carers pick up their child from school rather than catch the bus home due to unpredictable conditions in the area.

Thank you for your assistance. We appreciate you working with us during this time.

The morning buses will run and it is up to you as carer to escort your child onto their morning bus.

Teachers will be ready to collect students when they arrive at school.

The Bonny Hills buses will operate as normal.

It was a full house at Port Panthers last Thursday 24 October for the Koala SMART school's exhibition. More than 200 students, their families, teachers and supporters browsed the displays in the auditorium followed by the official announcements and award-winning projects.

Eight schools, primary and secondary, were included in the announcements as they highlighted ideas that will be explored in real-world application. Hastings-Macleay Koala Recovery Partnership Koala Ecologist, Dr Rebecca Montague-Drake said "in 2020 the Koala Smart Project Team will work with schools across the Hastings-Macleay Region to take some of those fantastic ideas and develop them further, ready for launch into the real-world where they can truly make a difference to koala conservation".

Lake Cathie Public School was acknowledged for their website project with real-world application being noted to an annual cupcake day to continue raising public awareness and to 'Jefferson's Journey' a picture book to be included in book packs for students and families to immerse themselves in reading and learning about koalas. We are so proud of our Koala Smart projects and the way students led the way in researching required information, designing methods to present their understandings and focusing on raising awareness of issues surrounding koalas. The quality of all entries into the Koala Smart project was so high. Students across the whole area rose to the challenge! North Haven Primary School was the recipient of the Primary School Award for their idea of a 'Hero Koala' to improve public awareness and be included in a children's television program designed to educate about koalas and the environment. The Secondary School Award went to Kempsey Adventist School for their '000 Koala Phone App' which provides the Koala Hospital with real-time information about koalas in the area that need assistance.

All projects have been on display at Settlement City Port Macquarie and Wauchope. Our mini koala will be returned to Lake Cathie in the coming weeks to be proudly displayed.

Thank you again to the Lake Cathie community for supporting our fundraising efforts. The \$1103 raised by Stage 2 students has adopted four koalas from the Koala Hospital and supported ongoing scientific research. The Koala Hospital have been so grateful for the effort.

Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6.7 billion over the next four years to deliver 190 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over five years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Lake Cathie Public School

A project is underway to upgrade Lake Cathie Public School. The upgrade will include:

- 17 new flexible learning spaces, inclusive of two Support Unit classrooms
- A new school hall
- The existing school hall will be refurbished into a new library and Special Programs Unit
- A new bus bay
- An upgrade to landscaping

Progress summary

Concept and schematic designs are finalised, with input from the school community. The detailed design has also commenced.

The State Significant Development Application (SSDA) was lodged with the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment in February 2019.

The construction tender has been awarded to AW Edwards. Construction is expected to start in early 2020, subject to planning approval.

School Infrastructure NSW will continue to work closely with the school community and share regular updates as the project progresses.



Road safety



Your guide to driving and parking safely near schools

The beginning and end of the school day are busy times for pedestrians and vehicles outside the school. That's why you need to take extra care in 40km/h school zones.

- Park safely and legally, even if it means walking further to the school gate. Parking signs are planned with children's safety in mind.
- Slow down to 40km/h in the school zone and stay aware of crossings.
- Always park and turn legally around the school.
- Never double park as it puts children at risk.
- Manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns are dangerous.
- Never park in a bus zone or in the school bus bay.
- Make sure your children use the Safety Door (rear footpath side door) to get in and out of the car.
- At a supervised crossing, observe the directions of the school crossing supervisor.
- Model safe and considerate behaviour for your child – they will learn from you.

Remember to always give way to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways. Don't park across the school driveway or the entrance to the school car park. It's always a good idea to use the drop off and pick up area suggested by your school. This will help keep all children as safe as possible during the busiest times of the school day.

Concerns with certain elements were discussed with the new project manager. The next meeting is scheduled for 8 November where the successful tenderer will be announced. • Looking at the bathroom designs for the new buildings. It looks like the bathrooms will have hand driers. • Christmas Concert - Camden Haven was chosen as the venue so the concert is not affected by the weather. It is also a nice connection as some of our previous students attend the school. Rehearsal will be done on the day at CHHS. Senior students will provide lighting, music etc. • Carols at the Lake – confirmed start time of 6pm. More details will be provided closer to the day. • Presentation Day – currently reviewing how to make the day a little more efficient. Start time to be advised. There will be a P&C President vote of thanks during the ceremony. • Enrolment Procedures Update – There will be a review and reminder of enrolment procedures. 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
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
